General Education Requirements

All students must fulfill the Carroll University Pioneer Core requirements including the **Cross-Cultural and Distribution Components** to receive their degree.

The **Cross-Cultural Component** includes: CCS199 Cultural Seminar, ENG170 Writing Seminar, **Cross-Cultural Development course (CCD)**, CCS300 Cross-Cultural Experience and CCS400 Global Perspectives Colloquium.

The **Distribution Component** includes four introductory level General Education 1 (G1) courses and one General Education 2 (GE2) course, outside of their major. A GE2 course must be from the same discipline as one of the GE1 courses (e.g., a GE1 Psychology course and a GE2 Psychology course). Distribution areas include: Fine Arts, Humanities, Philosophy/Ethics/Religion, Social Sciences and Natural Science. A general education course is not required in the same area as your degree, for example Exercise Science is a Natural Science program therefore no additional general education course is required.

Students earning an associate of arts or an associate of arts and sciences degree will have fulfilled various components of the Pioneer Core. *Transfer students with an Associate of Arts or an Associate of Arts & Science degree with at least 52 hours of acceptable transfer credit will have the writing seminar waived and will meet all GE 1 distribution components in the general education curriculum. In addition, transfer credit may be received for the CCD, GE2 and CCE requirements. * Please consult the Carroll University catalog for details.

University Convocation Program – attendance at 2 events per year is required of full-time students.

- Students must earn a minimum of 128 credits, with the last 32 credits completed at Carroll.
- Students must earn a minimum 2.0 cumulative grade point average, a minimum 2.0 Carroll University grade point average and a minimum 2.0 grade point average within their major.
- One-fourth of the major requirements must be completed at Carroll University.
- **A total of 64 credits may transfer from a two-year institution.**
