



College of Health Sciences: Nursing

The Carroll University BSN program builds on Carroll University's mission of providing a superior educational opportunity to our students, one grounded in the liberal arts tradition and focused on career preparation and lifelong learning. Nursing practice is built on nursing knowledge, theory, and research. Nursing practice derives knowledge from a wide array of other fields and disciplines, adapting and applying this knowledge as appropriate to professional practice. It is the mission of the Carroll University nursing program to prepare nurses for professional practice in a variety of settings, and to take on characteristics that will allow them to function in the generalist professional nursing role.

Delayed Admission - Transfer students may apply to the nursing major upon satisfaction of the following:

- 1. A cumulative GPA of 2.75 or higher in college coursework.
- 2. A professional science GPA of 2.75 or higher in college coursework.
- 3. Completion of ANP 130 Human Anatomy and Physiology I & CHE 101 General Chemistry (grades of B- or higher).
- 4. A minimum course grade of B- is required in all transfer coursework used to calculate the professional science GPA (ANP130, ANP140, BIO 212, CHE 101, CHE 102).

Candidates with science coursework more than five years old may be required to repeat coursework prior to application. Admission and progression standards are subject to change based on regulatory, licensing and/or certification needs. A selection committee makes decisions and applicants are notified through the Office of Admission. The process is a competitive one; simply satisfying the minimal criteria listed, does not guarantee an offer. Course sequencing plans are provided to students accepted to the nursing program resulting in a three to four year completion timeframe.

General Education Requirements

All students must fulfill the Carroll University Pioneer Core requirements including:

The five Cross-Cultural Components: CCS199 Cultural Seminar, ENG170 Writing Seminar (ENG101 or 102 at UW-M @ Waukesha), Cross-Cultural Development course (CCD), CCS300 Cross-Cultural Experience and CCS400 Global Perspectives Colloquium.

The Distribution Component includes four introductory level General Education 1 (G1) courses, and one higher-level General Education 2 (GE2) course, outside of their major. See chart on page 2 for suggested equivalencies. A GE2 course must be from the same discipline as one of the GE1 courses taken (e.g., GE1 English and a GE2 English course) or in a pre-approved cognate field.

Students will complete coursework in the Fine Arts, Humanities, Philosophy/Ethics/Religion, Social Sciences and Natural Science areas. Students earning an associate of arts or an associate of arts and sciences degree from UWMilw – Waukesha, will have fulfilled various components of the Pioneer Core. - Convocation Program attendance at 2 events per year is required of all full-time students.
- Students must earn a minimum of 128 credits, with the last 32 credits completed at Carroll.
- Nursing students must maintain a 2.75 or higher semester grade point average and earn BC or better grades in all nursing, science and health science coursework to satisfy the progression standards.
- One-fourth of the major requirements must be completed at Carroll University.
- A total of <u>64 credits</u> may transfer from a two-year institution.
