Visiting Lecturer in International Relations

Responsibilities: Responsibilities of this appointment include teaching classes on international relations, advising and mentoring students, and participating in program and departmental service. The successful candidate will participate in the General Education curriculum through teaching in the common core of cross-cultural studies. The normal teaching load for lecturer positions is four 4-credit courses per semester. The capacity to teach broad-based social science research methods is an asset for those applying for this opening.

Qualifications: PhD in International Relations, International Political Economy, Comparative Politics, or in related fields. All Comparative Politics and International Relations specializations will be considered. Ability to teach international political economy courses is required. Ph.D. in hand is strongly preferred; ABDs will be considered. The successful candidate will complement the department's current offerings and will share the University's commitment to quality undergraduate teaching. Evidence of teaching excellence is essential.

Rank and Salary: This is a full-time, 18-month, non-tenure track position as Instructional Faculty. Salary will be based on qualification and previous experience. The position is eligible for renewal.

The Department: The Department of History, Political Sciences, and Religious Studies offers majors in the following areas: history; global studies; political science; philosophy, political science and economics; and religious studies.
