TRANSFER OPTIONS

Completed AA or AS degree: Transfer students with an Associate of Arts, Associate of Applied Science, Associate of Science, or an Associate of Arts & Science degree will be exempt from the Pio Core curriculum. Mathematical literacy and foreign language requirements for B.S. and B.A. degrees may also be exempt unless the courses are required for the major. See catalog for specific major requirements.

IAI GECC: Transfer students without an associate degree, who have completed a minimum of 45 credit hours of transferable college-level coursework will be waived from the ENG170 Writing Seminar and GE1 distribution components. Transfer credits may fulfill the COM, GE2 and CCE requirements subject to evaluation. Transfer students completing *only* the IAI General Education Core at CLC (no AA/AS) will be evaluated for transfer credit on a course-by-course basis. General education curriculum requirements must be completed by either transfer or Carroll University credit. Individual majors may have additional prerequisites and/or requirements that are not covered by the IAI.

CLC coursework: All transfer coursework is evaluated on a course-by-course basis. There are no minimum requirements for transfer credits completed prior to transfer.

TRANSFER CREDITS

Students from a two-year or four-year regionally accredited post-secondary institution may receive transfer credits provided transfer courses parallel Carroll University courses or are deemed eligible for elective credit. A maximum of 72 credits may transfer from a two-year institution. All transfer coursework must be graded C- or better to be accepted as credit earned towards graduation and to meet course requirements, including Pioneer Core distribution courses and major and minor requirement courses. See catalog for specific major admission/progression policies.

A course in which a student receives a D or F grade may be repeated for credit and only the last grade earned will be used in the GPA calculation. All D and F graded courses normally acceptable for transfer credit will be factored into the transfer GPA for admission eligibility to Carroll University. Students must complete their final 32 credits at Carroll, including at least one-fourth of their major and minor (if applicable) credits.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Admission to Carroll University is offered to those for whom academic and personal success seems likely. Each candidate is evaluated individually. Evidence of ability to do university level work is essential. Students must normally be eligible to return in good standing (be free of academic or disciplinary probation) to all institutions previously attended. A minimum GPA of 2.0 is required for transfer. Admission criteria and academic progression standards for specific programs may differ. See catalog for details.

CALCULATION OF ADMISSION GPA

If a student repeated a course in which they initially received a grade of C- or better and the repeated course had an unsatisfactory grade (D or F), they will receive the last grade earned. The final grade will be used in the GPA calculation.

APPLICATION

Students are encouraged to file an application for admission for the first semester (fall) before March 15. Applications will be considered and qualified candidates will be accepted if there are openings in the entering class. Applications and all supporting documents for admission to the second semester should be filed before November 1. Carroll University offers rolling admission.

SCHOLARSHIPS (2025-2026)

- EXCEL SCHOLARSHIP - Renewable scholarship of \$20,000 per year.
Qualifications: Awarded to full-time students transferring into Carroll who have a cumulative GPA between 3.3 and 4.0 for all previous post-secondary work.
- FOUNDERS SCHOLARSHIP - Renewable scholarship of \$19,000 per year.
Qualifications: Awarded to full-time students transferring into Carroll who have a cumulative GPA between 2.8 and 3.29 for all previous post-secondary work.
- HERITAGE SCHOLARSHIP - Renewable scholarship of \$18,000 per year.
Qualifications: Awarded to full-time students transferring into Carroll who have a cumulative GPA between 2.5 and 2.79 for all previous post-secondary work.
