



Assistant Professor of Asian History/Asian Studies

Starting Date: September 1, 2012

Qualifications: Candidates should hold a Ph.D. in History or Asian Studies. Teaching responsibilities include the two-course world history survey and upper-level courses in the candidate's field of expertise. Successful candidates will be prepared to contribute to Carroll's cross-cultural general education program and support the university's emerging partnerships in China (Hong Kong), Vietnam and Korea. Preference will be given to applicants with a demonstrated commitment to undergraduate teaching, with priority given to candidates who can offer a course or courses in Political Science or Global Studies. The teaching load is 3 (4-credit) courses each semester (fall and spring); service and an active research agenda are also expected.

Rank and Salary: Assistant Professor, Tenure Track. Salary is competitive and commensurate with qualifications.

The Program: The History Program is part of the Department of History, Political Science, and Religion, and is housed within the College of Humanities and Social Sciences.

The College: The College of Humanities and Social Sciences includes the Department of Communication and Sociology, the Department of Education, the Department of English and Modern Languages, the Department of History, Politics, and Religion, and the Department of Visual and Performing Arts. The College offers a wide range of academic and interdisciplinary programs of study and serves as an integral component of the general education core requirements.

The University: Founded in 1846, Carroll University is an independent, co-educational comprehensive institution grounded in the liberal arts tradition. Carroll University is located in suburban Waukesha, 16 miles west of Milwaukee and 60 miles east of Madison.
