

## Clinical Assistant Professor of Physical Therapy

**Description:** Clinical Assistant Professor of Physical Therapy-12 Month

**Starting Date:** September 1, 2010

**Qualifications:** The ideal candidate is a physical therapist with a terminal degree (D.Sc., PhD). The program will consider those who hold an advanced Masters degree or Masters or Doctoral candidates who possess ABPTS or equivalent certification. Current physical therapy licensure or eligibility for licensure in the state of Wisconsin is required.

**Responsibilities:** Primary responsibilities include teaching in and coordination of the musculoskeletal track (biomechanics and musculoskeletal physical therapy courses) or professional practice track (five course clinical decision making sequence and three course professional practice sequence). Opportunities for clinical practice, grant development, and involvement in local and international service learning initiatives are available. Candidates who are innovative and value a dynamic and comprehensive approach to curriculum, instruction, and physical therapy practice in an interdisciplinary environment are encouraged to apply.

**Rank and Salary:** Commensurate with qualifications.

**The Program:** The Doctor of Physical Therapy (DPT) program is housed within the Department of Health and Human Movement Sciences, in the Division of Natural and Health Sciences. It is closely affiliated with the Athletic Training, Exercise Science, Physical and Health Education, Public Health, Recreational Management, Nursing, and developing Physician Assistant programs. The DPT program is a fully accredited, 3+3, direct admission program. In the fall of 2010 the Physical Therapy program will be relocating to a newly renovated, state of the art, 55,000 sq. ft. interdisciplinary graduate teaching and research facility. This facility will house comprehensive teaching and laboratory space, including muscle strengthening and cardiovascular training equipment, portable and laboratory-based gas analyses systems, state-of-the-art video and computer motion analysis, force, and EMG measurement technology. A robust service learning program exists within the Physical Therapy and other health sciences programs to serve the healthy, diseased, disabled, and underserved within the local and international community. Opportunities also exist for continued clinical practice.

**The Division:** The Division of Natural and Health Sciences includes the Department of Chemistry, Mathematics and Physics, the Department of Life Sciences, the Department of Health and Human Movement Sciences and the Department of Nursing. The Division has received federal and private foundation grant awards and has offered multiple study abroad programs. The Division has a strong staff of support personnel and laboratory coordinators.

**Carroll University:** Founded in 1846, Carroll University is an independent, co-educational comprehensive college grounded in the liberal arts tradition. Carroll University is located in suburban Waukesha, 16 miles west of Milwaukee and 60 miles east of Madison. The University serves approximately 2500 full-time and 800 part-time students.
