EMERITI FACULTY

Prof. Jeffrey Kunz

Jeffrey T. Kunz, assistant professor of accounting, joined the Carroll faculty in 1981. He holds a B.B.A. in business and accounting from St. Norbert College and a master of science degree in accounting from the University of Wisconsin-Whitewater. While at Carroll, Professor Kunz has developed a four-year CPA emphasis program and a partnership program with Waukesha County Technical College and the Milwaukee Area Technical College. He also created an accounting internship/mentorship program and has been director since 1999.



Professor Kunz has served on many committees at Carroll, including budget planning, academic affairs, admissions and student life. In 2016, he was appointed by Carroll's president to become a College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin (CCIW) faculty athletic representative.

Professor Kunz has been honored with the 2012 Norman and Louise Allhiser Award for Excellence in Teaching and the 2010 BAE Outstanding Teacher Award. He is a member of the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants (AICPA), the Wisconsin Institute of Certified Public Accountants (WICPA) and the Institute of Management Accountants (IMA).

EMERITI STAFF

Mr. Stephen R. Kuhn

Steve Kuhn began his time as the Vice President of Institutional Advancement at Carroll University in February 2009. Upon Steve's arrival, he re-tooled the advancement staff, put plans in motion and soon began work on a \$50 million campaign.



Under President Douglas Hastad, and Steve Kuhn's leadership, Carroll embraced the task head-on—and forged ahead with an ambitious goal. With Doug and Steve's penchant for building relationships and their endless energy, Carroll was positioned for a successful campaign in the making.

In 2016, Carroll wrapped up the largest, most ambitious fundraising initiative in Carroll's history. Campaign Carroll: The Common Thread exceeded its original target of \$50 million—raising over \$52.7 million to support facilities, programs, endowment and operating needs. Comprehensive campaigns are made up of many, many donors. In fact, we had 7,533 donors—every one of which was important to our success.

The Michael and Mary Jaharis Laboratories marked two significant firsts for Carroll. It was the first new academic building constructed in over 50 years and most importantly, it was the first all gift/grant building in Carroll's history.

While the Jaharis Laboratories and Prairie Springs Environmental Education Center were two of the most recent and largest projects during Steve's tenure, there have been over 65 construction projects and dedication of new spaces enhancing Carroll's ability to better meet the needs of our students including the Crofts Morava Pavilion, Doug and Nancy Hastad Hall, the renovation of Rankin Hall, Richard Smart House and Shirley Hilger Hall, amongst others.

Honorary Degree Presentation

As part of the 2020 Commencement Ceremony, Carroll University will award Dr. Barbara Horner-Ibler '80, founder and physician of Bread of Healing Clinic with an honorary Doctor of Humane Letters degree. This honorary degree recognizes service to society in the area of healthcare, humanitarianism, philanthropy and politics.

Preparing students for vocational success, lifelong learning and service in a diverse and global society is Carroll's mission. Each year, we select a theme that is integrated into campus events and activities. For the 2019–20 academic year, our theme is respect. Dr. Horner-Ibler is known throughout the Milwaukee area as a community leader who embodies respect, and we are pleased to honor her achievements with this honorary degree.



Dr. Barbara Horner-Ibler '80, founder and physician of Bread of Healing Clinic

Dr. Horner-Ibler is a well-known physician and one of the founders of Bread of Healing Clinic, which provides free, high-quality medical, dental and behavioral care to approximately 2,000 low-income patients a year. It now has three locations throughout Milwaukee: Cross Lutheran Church, Eastbrook Church and All People's Lutheran Church-Havenwoods.



She started the clinic in 2000 with Rick Cesar, a nurse who is the clinic manager, and with Dr. Tom Jackson, who continues his service to the clinic and is board emeritus of the board of directors.

Dr. Horner-Ibler, who was honored with Carroll's Distinguished Alumnus Award for Community Service in 2009, also has received awards for her work in medicine, social work and teaching.

In 2019, the Medical Society of Milwaukee recognized Dr. Horner-Ibler with its Dr. Erastus B. Wolcott Distinguished Service Award for her care for the underserved. In 2017, she received the Sigurd Sivertson Medical Education Award from the Wisconsin Medical Alumni Association, and in 2013, she was honored with the Addis Costello Award from the Wisconsin Chapter of the American College of Physicians.

Dr. Horner-Ibler also was named 2010 Social Worker of the Year by the Wisconsin Association of Social Workers, Southeastern Wisconsin Branch.

And in 2007 and 2009, she earned the Excellence in Teaching Award from the University of Wisconsin School of Medicine and Public Health.

COMMENCEMENT SPEAKER

A fellow in the American College of Physicians since 2014, she is a licensed advanced practice social worker and a licensed Presbyterian minister.

In addition to earning a bachelor's in religion and German from Carroll, she holds an M.D. from the University of Wisconsin-Madison, a master's in social work from the University of Chicago and a master's of divinity from Princeton Theological Seminary.

COMMENCEMENT TRADITIONS

Academic Regalia

The pageantry of Carroll University's Commencement ceremony is derived from the traditions of European universities of the Middle Ages. Scholars at these early universities were primarily members of religious orders, and they adapted the regalia of their monasteries to the academic setting. The cold, stone lecture halls of medieval universities necessitated long gowns, hoods and caps for warmth. Due to our nation's British heritage, academic regalia has been worn at universities and colleges in the United States since colonial times. To ensure uniformity, an intercollegiate commission has established regulations for academic gowns, hoods and caps that are accepted by most educational institutions.

Today's scholarly garments are similar to those of the Middle Ages. The cap, called a mortarboard, is a symbol of academic freedom. According to legend, freed Roman slaves received the privilege of wearing a cap. The cap's tassel is usually black, although scholars holding a doctorate degree may wear a gold one.

The flowing gown symbolizes the democracy of scholarship, since it covers clothes that would otherwise indicate the rank and social status of an individual. Together, the academic gown and hood signify the type of degree earned and official colors of the educational institution granting the degree. The master's gown is black with arc-shaped sleeves, while the doctor's gown is usually black with velvet panels and bars that might indicate the wearer's field of study.

Traditionally, the colors of the velvet trim on a doctor's hood represented one of the three original terminal degrees: crimson (the color of Christ's robe) for Doctor of Divinity, deep blue (the color of truth) for Doctor of Philosophy and green (the epaulets on the uniform of the British surgeon general) for Doctor of Medicine. Today, the color of the hood's velvet trim indicates the field in which the wearer earned his or her degree:

Powder blue—Master of Art in Teaching

Drab—Master of Business Administration

Powder blue—Master of Education

Powder blue—Master of Science in Educational Leadership

Sage green—Master of Science in Exercise Physiology

Ink—Master of Occupational Therapy

Green—Master of Science in Physician Assistant Studies

Orange—Master of Software Engineering

Sage green—Doctor of Physical Therapy

COMMENCEMENT TRADITIONS

The hoods representing American universities and colleges are lined in satin with the official academic colors of the institution that conferred the degree. Thus, the graduates of Carroll University receive hoods displaying the university's official colors of orange and white.

Today, many of our graduates are wearing academic regalia in addition to the traditional cap, gown and hood. The following items signify students' memberships in academic honor societies and other affiliations:

Gold cord—Delta Sigma Nu, *Carroll University's honorary scholastic society*

Gold tassel—Carroll University Honors Program

Red and green cord—Beta Beta Beta, *national biological honor society*

Red and white cord—Lambda Pi Eta, *national communication honor society*

Red and light blue cord—Phi Alpha Theta, *national history honor society*

Gold and blue medallion on a blue ribbon—The Honor Society of Phi Kappa Phi, *the nation's oldest, largest and most selective all-discipline honor society*

Cloisonné medallion on a red ribbon—Pi Sigma Alpha, *national political science honor society*

Blue, white and gold medallion on royal blue and gold ribbon—Psi Chi, *national psychology honor society*

Red and gold cord—Sigma Delta Pi, *national collegiate Hispanic honor society*

Orchid and white cord—Sigma Theta Tau International, *nursing honor society*

Red, white and blue cord—Military service or veteran

International flag stole—Carroll University International Program
or international student

Blue and yellow cords—“Who's Who Among Students in American Universities and Colleges” honoree

Orange and blue stole—Four-year student athlete

Royal blue and white cords—Founding mentors for the Carroll University Preparing and Advancing Students for Opportunities in Science (PASOS) Program

Orange and white cords—Legacy student

Blue and orange cords—Health Careers Opportunity Program (HCOP) students

COMMENCEMENT TRADITIONS

Presidential Medallion

The presidential medallion consists of a large silver Carroll University seal that is highlighted in gray enamel. Directly above the seal is a silver leaf banner bearing the name of the current president. Further up the chain, each side is flanked by two small, silver Carroll College seals, also highlighted in gray enamel. The chain culminates in two silver Presbyterian crosses on each side. The connecting links are made up of individual silver curved banners engraved with the names of Carroll's preceding 14 presidents and their dates of leadership.

Mace Bearer

Formal academic processions include a mace bearer, whose metal mace is the symbol of the university's authority. During medieval times, the function of this person was to defend the president of the university. As a result, custom dictates that the mace bearer always be in sight of the president. During the Commencement ceremony, the mace is placed on a rack in full view of the audience and easily accessible to the mace bearer. This indicates that the university faculty is present to conduct formal and legal business. Carroll's mace was designed by Marceil Pultorak, professor emeritus of art, and features a set of medallions displaying the official seal and motto of the institution. The mace was first used during Baccalaureate and Commencement ceremonies in 1987.

Academic Procession

In addition to the mace bearer, the academic procession includes members of the board of trustees, faculty and administration of Carroll University, graduates and honored guests. The tradition of the bagpipe band comes from the Scottish Presbyterian Church. At the beginning of their first year, new students are escorted into the university's Opening Convocation by a single bagpiper. Today, we honor our graduates by piping them into and out of the ceremony with a full complement of bagpipers.

Official Presbyterian Cross

On June 8, 1985, the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church (USA) voted unanimously to adopt the symbol found on the back of this program as the official seal of our denomination. This symbol can also be seen on Shattuck Music Center.

We are invited to see in it whatever we see, but among the artist's ideas are a fish and a dove, a cross, triangle, a chalice and flames. The half-circle suggests the circle of the Celtic Cross, a symbol long associated with Presbyterian history. The flames remind us of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. One can also see a pulpit with the contours of an open book, emphasizing the importance our Reformed tradition has placed on the role of scripture in our faith and lives. The flames are designed so that, with the center of the cross as one point, and the bottom of the design as a side, we can see a triangle, reaffirming our Trinitarian faith.

Some people also see in the design the suggestion of a person. Perhaps it is Jesus... perhaps it is you.

International Flags

As part of today's celebration, Carroll University is proud to fly the flags representing the country of origin of each of the graduating international students. These flags can be found on the flag plaza near East Avenue, below the flags of the United States of America, State of Wisconsin and Carroll University.

China—Red with a large yellow five-pointed star and four smaller yellow five-pointed stars (arranged in a vertical arc toward the middle of the flag) in the upper hoist-side corner

France—Three equal vertical bands of blue (hoist side), white and red

Germany—Three equal horizontal bands of black (top), red and gold

India—Three equal horizontal bands of deep saffron (top), white and green, with the Ashoka Chakra, a 24-spoke wheel, in navy blue centered in the white band

Nepal—Crimson red with a blue border around the unique shape of two overlapping right triangles; the smaller, upper triangle bears a white stylized moon and the larger, lower triangle displays a white 12-pointed sun

Sri Lanka—Dark red rectangular panel bordered in yellow containing a yellow lion holding a sword upright in its right forepaw, and four bo leaves, one in each corner, and next to the hoist two vertical stripes, green and orange, also bordered in yellow together

Thailand—Five horizontal bands of red (top), white, blue (double width), white and red

United Kingdom—Blue field with the red cross of Saint George (patron saint of England) edged in white superimposed on the diagonal red cross of Saint Patrick (patron saint of Ireland), which is superimposed on the diagonal white cross of Saint Andrew (patron saint of Scotland)

Vietnam—Red field with a large, yellow five-pointed star in the center
