**ASSOCIATE OF ARTS & ASSOCIATE OF SCIENCE
ARTICULATION AGREEMENT**

Carroll University acknowledges the course offerings and preparation of the students from the University of Wisconsin-Waukesha (UW-W) therefore:

1. UW-W students seeking application to Carroll University must submit the following credentials: the Carroll University application, official transcript from the last secondary school attended, official transcripts from all post-secondary institutions attended, and the University academic report form. Applicants must be eligible to return in good standing (be free of academic or disciplinary probation) to all institutions previously attended.
2. UW-W students who have earned Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degrees who are admitted to Carroll University with at least 52 hours of acceptable transfer credit will have the writing seminar waived and will meet all GE1 distribution components in the general education curriculum. In addition, transfer credit may be received for the CCD, GE2 and CCE requirements.
3. All transfer students from a two-year accredited college-level institution may receive up to 64 credits, provided these transfer courses at least parallel courses offered at Carroll University and all courses accepted in transfer and applied to graduation hours are graded C or better.
4. All transfer students must complete the last 32 credits at Carroll. Students must complete at least one-fourth of their major credits and at least one-fourth of the courses in their declared minor at Carroll.
5. UW-W courses will transfer in accordance with established Carroll University transfer procedures as updated and modified periodically by the academic departments. Please see the current Carroll University catalog for additional academic and transfer credit provisions.
6. Full-time applicants with a minimum transfer GPA of 2.5 may be eligible for a merit-based scholarship. Please consult an admission counselor for current scholarship amounts.
7. Courses completed at institutions other than the University of Wisconsin-Waukesha will be evaluated separately.
8. Both Carroll University and the University of Wisconsin-Waukesha can market this agreement.
