

## General Education Requirements

The following are courses that can be taken at the UW-Colleges to fulfill Carroll University degree requirements. Check the options for transfer with an Associates degree. All students must fulfill General Education (G1 and G2) requirement areas at Carroll University. Consult the Carroll University catalog for clarification. Students may wish to enroll concurrently in the Carroll program.

Students should consult with the counselors at Carroll for a recommended progression of coursework in their chosen major. Students may wish to enroll concurrently in the Carroll program.

### Graduation Requirements:

- 1) ENG 101 or 102. We require only one semester of composition.
- 2) The Bachelor of Science degree requires MAT 117 and ECO 243\*or MAT 211 and CPS 216. MAT 117 or MAT 211 may be specific for certain majors. (\*CMP 114 can be completed at Carroll or ECO 243 taken at UWW.) The Bachelor of Arts degree requires the completion of two years of an international language (or the equivalent). Select programs offer 2 options for the Bachelor of Arts degree requirements. Consult the Carroll catalog for details.
- 3) All students must demonstrate math proficiency at the MAT 113 level or higher.
- 4) A cross cultural experience and global perspectives colloquium are also required; to be completed at Carroll University.

### General Education (GE1 and GE2)

Students expand their knowledge outside their major area of study by completing one class in each of the four remaining distribution areas outside of their major area (G1). Students do not need to take an additional course in their major area (see distribution chart). Students must take a GE2 course in one of the four remaining distribution areas. One G1 or G2 course must also meet a cross-cultural designation (CCD).
