Transfer to Carroll University for Bachelor of Science Degree with WCTC Associate Degree in **Early Childhood Education** Program

When should I apply to Carroll?

- Carroll has a rolling admission process; therefore, students may apply at any time for admission.
- Students must submit an admission application (no fee), an official high school transcript, official transcript from all post-secondary institutions attended and the academic report form (from the last school attended). See <http://www.carrollu.edu/prospective/transfer/> for details.

Am I guaranteed admission to TEP at Carroll University with an associate degree from WCTC? Is there a minimum GPA required for admission?

An associate's degree does not guarantee admission to TEP at Carroll. Students accepted to Carroll University are allowed to enroll in 100 and 200 level Education courses without formal acceptance to TEP. To be eligible for program admission, students need to meet the following requirements:

- Students must have completed at least 40 undergraduate credits with a minimum grade point average of 2.75 as well as a grade of C or better in all education major and minor courses, English 170, and CCS 100 or COM 101 or equivalent.
- Candidates apply to the Teacher Education Program (TEP) by September 25 for fall TEP admission and by January 25 for spring TEP admission.
- Students will need 150 documented clock hours of work with children.
- Students must successfully meet state testing requirements. Students need to have completed the CORE Skills Test in mathematics, reading, and writing with passing scores in all three areas. ACT/SAT or GRE scores may also qualify for the CORE/PPST exam.
- Students submit their Phase I portfolio to provide initial evidence of their development as a teacher and learner. Students are admitted to the TEP before prior to enrollment in any Education course over the 200-level.

How many credits will transfer from my WCTC program to Carroll University?

- The answer depends on the program and which electives you may have chosen while enrolled in your program at WCTC. Carroll University will accept no more than 64 transfer credits from a 2 year institution (1/2 of the number needed for a bachelor's degree). Please consult with Carroll University for specific details about your program.
