Visiting Lecturer of Occupational Therapy— Limited Term

Starting Date: 5/1/18

Carroll University seeks two part-time instructional faculty members for its accredited and innovative Master of Occupational Therapy program. Instructional faculty will play an integral role in curriculum implementation and assessment. The instructional faculty members work collaboratively with program faculty, administrators, and external occupational therapy and health care constituencies. Candidates who are innovative, and value a collaborative, dynamic and comprehensive approach to instruction and occupational therapy practice are encouraged to apply. The Program's two limited term positions begin 5/1/18 and conclude 12/31/18.

Qualifications: Carroll University (www.carrollu.edu) invites applications for the position Limited term Instructional Faculty. Candidates will:

- Hold a minimum of a master's degree in occupational therapy, awarded by an institution that is accredited by a regional accrediting body recognized by the U.S. Department of Education. Candidates must be a licensed occupational therapist initially certified and registered with the National Board for Certification in Occupational Therapy. Current licensure or eligibility for licensure in the state of Wisconsin is required.
- A minimum of 3 years' professional practice experience as an OT is desired. Postsecondary-level teaching experience is preferred.
- Candidates with other health sciences terminal degrees (NP, DO, MD or PhD) will also be considered.
- Successful applicants will possess expertise in the area of pediatrics or neuroscience

Responsibilities: Responsibilities of this limited term appointment in the Master of Occupational Therapy program include didactic and clinical teaching, as well as program specific service. Primary teaching expertise in neuroscience or pediatric-related content is required. Other teaching responsibilities based on applicant expertise and program needs. Potential areas for additional teaching may include capstone/research supervision, evidence based practice principles, clinical education coordination or practicum instruction. Participation in program service will include student admissions and advising tasks.

Rank and Salary: Instructional Faculty. Salary is competitive and commensurate with qualifications.

The Program: The Carroll Master of Occupational Therapy (MOT) program annually enrolls a 30 student cohort to its full-time, 24 month, 88 credit curriculum designed in the context of the Carroll University mission and ACOTE standards. The curriculum includes a unique three-course series in medical humanities consistent with the Carroll liberal arts heritage and a three-course service learning series that focuses on culturally appropriate care and service to underrepresented populations. The MOT program is housed within the Department of Health and Medicine and is located in a 55,000 sq. ft. interdisciplinary graduate teaching and research facility. This facility provides comprehensive teaching

and laboratory space specifically designed for the MOT program. In addition, the program utilizes the newly built Michael and Mary Jaharis Laboratories for its state-of-the-art cadaver lab and Anatomage Dissection table and has access to a recently opened 15,000 square foot nursing simulation laboratory in the Douglas N. and Nancy J. Hastad Hall. The MOT program currently has funding through a HRSA Primary Care Training and Enhancement grant, with a focus on integrative health, interprofessional experiences, and health literacy.

The Department: The Department of Health and Medicine includes the Master of Occupational Therapy and the Master of Science in Physician Assistant Studies graduate programs as well as the following majors: Health Sciences—Diagnostic Medical Sonography, Health Sciences—Radiologic Technology, Medical Laboratory Sciences, Public Health, and minors in Health Education and Health and the Human Experience. The Department also includes a robust inter-professional initiative with Nursing, Physical Therapy, and Human Movement Sciences departments.

The College: The College of Health Sciences offers undergraduate and graduate programs through four departments—Health and Medicine, Human Movement Sciences (athletic training, exercise science, exercise physiology); Nursing; and Physical Therapy (DPT). Health sciences account for ~60% of the University enrollment. The mission of the College of Health Science is to educate students to be innovative professionals who collaborate to serve the health needs of their communities. A dynamic and growing entity, College wide foci include interprofessional education and practice, the integrated approach to health, innovative learning and healthcare technologies, community partnerships and service to medically underserved populations. The College supports the interdisciplinary nature of health science education and has received federal and private foundation grant awards to support these as well as program specific initiatives. The college has a strong staff of academic administrative and support staff personnel.

The University: Founded in 1846, Carroll University is an independent, co-educational comprehensive University. The Carroll mission is to “provide a superior education, rooted in its Presbyterian and liberal arts heritage, and draws upon the Christian tradition to prepare all students for vocational success, lifelong learning and service in a diverse and global society.” Carroll University is located in suburban Waukesha, 16 miles west of Milwaukee and 60 miles east of Madison. The University serves 3600 undergraduate and graduate students. The University though intentionally ecumenical and non-sectarian in approach, is related to the Presbyterian Church, USA. Candidates must be willing and able to support and advance the University mission.

Application: Review of applications will begin immediately and continue until the position is filled.
