FACULTY AWARDS

ALLHISER AWARD: Dr. Gail Vojta

Dr. Gail M. Vojta received her doctorate from the University of Minnesota and her bachelor's degree in chemistry from St. Olaf College. Upon graduation, Dr. Vojta taught at several colleges in Iowa and Wisconsin before joining the Carroll chemistry/biochemistry program in 2007. In 2014, she was one of the first instructional faculty to be promoted to Distinguished Lecturer. At Carroll, Dr. Vojta has taught students primarily in the first- and second-year chemistry courses. Outside the classroom she has mentored new full-time faculty and adjunct faculty, worked on initiatives in faculty development and assessment, volunteered at STEM workshops for girls and continued to improve the laboratory curricula for health science students as well as chemistry majors. She is grateful for the support of her family, colleagues, and students who have taught her so much about teaching and learning.



RICHASON AWARD: Dr. Amy McQuade

Dr. Amy McQuade, clinical associate professor of physical therapy, has been a member of the Carroll faculty since 2010. She holds a doctorate in physiology from the Medical College of Wisconsin, a master's degree in physical therapy from the University of Wisconsin-Madison and a bachelor's degree in physiology from Michigan State University. She is a licensed physical therapist and has over 14 years of clinical experience primarily in the acute care setting. Dr. McQuade teaches multiple courses in the physical therapy program, with a focus on the general medical sequence. She is also the physical therapy department curriculum coordinator and contributes to program assessment and accreditation. Her scholarship interests include teaching and simulation in physical therapy education, and she has been fortunate to collaborate with faculty at Carroll University—both within and outside of the physical therapy department. She has a record of peer-reviewed presentations at national physical therapy and interdisciplinary meetings. McQuade has served the university on numerous committees and is the faculty advisor to the Physical Therapy Club. She is a founding member of the Simulation Library Committee for the American Council of Academic Physical Therapy.



FACULTY AWARDS

FACULTY ADVISOR: Dr. Lee Lee

Dr. Lee Lee has been an assistant professor in the animal behavior program at Carroll since 2020. They received their doctorate in animal science from the University of Tennessee, master's degree in animal science from the University of



Kentucky and bachelor's degree in biology from Knox College. On top of managing the canine training program, Dr. Lee actively advises 35 pre-vet and animal behavior students. Dr. Lee is also the advisor for Gender Sexuality Alliance (GSA) and Carroll Students for Animal Welfare (CSAW). Dr. Lee is incredibly grateful to be a part of the Carroll community and happy to represent our students from all backgrounds.

FACULTY ADVISOR: Tamra Fricke

Ms. Tamra Fricke has been working as the director of music therapy at Carroll University since 2019. Fricke received her Master of Arts from St. Mary-of-the-Woods College and her Bachelor of Music from Alverno College. Previously, she



worked at Seasons Hospice & Palliative Care in Milwaukee, beginning in, where she also completed her internship and trained 10 interns. She also holds additional certificates as a Hospice & Palliative Care Music Therapist, and NICU Music Therapist. Fricke truly enjoys being an educator and working with the next generation of music therapists. In her non-work life, Fricke enjoys crocheting, sewing, yoga, spending time with her daughter and husband and participating in a Highland Dance group in Milwaukee.

EMERITAE FACULTY

Peggy Thurston Farrell

Ms. Peggy Thurston Farrell is an associate professor of art at Carroll University, where she taught printmaking and design, was in charge of Carroll's Wisconsin Collection of Art and served as the Bliss Gallery director for 31 years. Farrell received



her MFA in printmaking from the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee and her Bachelor of Arts from Carroll College. Her work was widely collected and exhibited. Over the years, her work evolved from the two-dimensional print medium to collaged, painted and silkscreened three-dimensional paper and wood constructions. Most recently, her work became more political as she addresses issues of government corruption, pollution and land mismanagement.

Dr. Pamela Pinahs-Schultz

Dr. Pamela Pinahs-Schultz is a professor in the public health program, where she taught a variety of courses and led many initiatives including preparing the program for accreditation. She served as Carroll's assessment director for 20 years



and is also a Peer Reviewer for the Higher Learning Commission. Dr. Pinahs-Schultz served as a collaboration consultant/evaluator and traveling workshop facilitator on curriculum design, program evaluation, teaching and assessment of student learning. Additionally, Dr. Pinahs-Schultz conducted an Institute for New Faculty Development. She was recently chosen to serve on the Academy on Persistence and Completion (APC), an initiative of the Higher Learning Commission (HLC), focused on retention and graduation of the nation's college and university students. Dr. Pinahs-Schultz has published on classroom, program, and general education assessment and curriculum development. During her

time at Carroll Dr. Pinahs-Schultz also served as the interim dean of Students and Institutional Research.

EMERITAE FACULTY

Dr. Peggy Kasimatis

Dr. Peggy Kasimatis is a clinical psychologist who began as an adjunct instructor at Carroll in the 1980s and continued to teach psychology courses for several decades as an assistant professor. More recently, as an associate professor, Dr. Kasimatis taught



psychology-related coursework for health science and education programs, including graduate courses in behavioral health, physician assistant studies, health education and occupational therapy. She was integral in connecting to community partners such as Rogers Behavioral Health, Curative Rehab, Spring City Clubhouse and Avalon Square Assisted Living. During her 30 plus years at Carroll, Dr. Kasimatis has presented at over twenty conferences. Her work was published in numerous journals, primarily in the area of test anxiety, death anxiety, midlife generativity, cognitive training in the elderly and mental health literacy training.

Kathy Sampson

Ms. Kathy Sampson has been a part of the Carroll University community since 2008. Sampson came to Carroll with 25 years of nursing experience. Her vast amount of clinical knowledge, experience and skills are greatly appreciated by her students



and colleagues. Sampson became the faculty liaison for the nursing Peer mentor program, BSN Lab assistants and the Student Nurses Association. She developed and taught several courses across the curriculum. Sampson also served for several years as the organizer of the White Coat Ceremony, a tradition in nursing, demonstrating entry into the professional program. She served on a variety of committees, while also serving as tutor coordinator.

Honorary Degree Presentation

As part of the 2022 Commencement ceremony, Carroll University will award an honorary Doctor of Humane Letters degree.

This honorary degree recognizes service to society in the area of healthcare, humanitarianism, philanthropy and politics.



DR. ROBERT BALLARD



Best known for his 1985 discovery of the sunken remains of the RMS Titanic, Dr. Ballard is a renowned deep-sea explorer, scholar of underwater archaeology, distinguished professor of oceanography and retired American naval officer. He has many outstanding lifetime achievements, including the discovery of hydrothermal vents and the development of deep-sea submersibles and remotely operated vehicle (ROV) systems.

Dr. Ballard succeeded in uncovering numerous other significant shipwrecks, including the battleship Bismarck in 1989, the aircraft carrier USS Yorktown in 1998 and the wreck of John F. Kennedy's PT-109 in 2002. He has taken part in more than 155 deep-sea expeditions throughout his career.

Today, Dr. Ballard is an explorer-in-residence at National Geographic and continues to lead oceanic expeditions.

COMMENCEMENT TRADITIONS

Academic Regalia

The pageantry of Carroll University's Commencement ceremony is derived from the traditions of European universities of the Middle Ages. Scholars at these early universities were primarily members of religious orders, and they adapted the regalia of their monasteries to the academic setting. The cold, stone lecture halls of medieval universities necessitated long gowns, hoods and caps for warmth. Due to our nation's British heritage, academic regalia has been worn at universities and colleges in the United States since colonial times. To ensure uniformity, an intercollegiate commission has established regulations for academic gowns, hoods and caps that are accepted by most educational institutions.

Today's scholarly garments are similar to those of the Middle Ages. The cap, called a mortarboard, is a symbol of academic freedom. According to legend, freed Roman slaves received the privilege of wearing a cap. The cap's tassel is usually black, although scholars holding a doctorate degree may wear a gold one.

The flowing gown symbolizes the democracy of scholarship, since it covers clothes that would otherwise indicate the rank and social status of an individual. Together, the academic gown and hood signify the type of degree earned and official colors of the educational institution granting the degree. The master's gown is black with arc-shaped sleeves, while the doctor's gown is usually black with velvet panels and bars that might indicate the wearer's field of study.

Today, many of our graduates are wearing academic regalia in addition to the traditional cap, gown and hood. The following items signify students' memberships in academic honor societies and other affiliations:

Gold cord—Delta Sigma Nu, *Carroll University's honorary scholastic society*

Gold tassel—*Carroll University Honors Program*

Red and green cord—Beta Beta Beta, *national biological honor society*

Red and white cord—Lambda Pi Eta, *national communication honor society*

Red and light blue cord—Phi Alpha Theta, *national history honor society*

Gold and blue medallion on a blue ribbon—The Honor Society of Phi Kappa Phi, *the nation's oldest, largest and most selective all-discipline honor society*

Cloisonné medallion on a red ribbon—Pi Sigma Alpha, *national political science honor society*

Blue, white and gold medallion on royal blue and gold ribbon—Psi Chi, *national psychology honor society*

Red and gold cord—Sigma Delta Pi, *national collegiate Hispanic honor society*

Orchid and white cord—Sigma Theta Tau International, *nursing honor society*

Red, white and blue cord—Military service or veteran

Latin Honors are used to indicate the level of distinction with which an academic degree was earned. These honors are based on a student’s cumulative grade point average. To be eligible for Latin Honors, a student must have completed all degree requirements. Cum Laude is a Latin term for *with honor*.

- Cum Laude, Latin for *with honor*, recognizes a candidate for graduation who earned a grade point average of 3.400
- Magna Cum Laude, Latin for *with great honor*, recognizes a candidate for graduation who earned a grade point average of 3.600
- Summa Cum Laude, Latin for *with highest honor*, recognizes a candidate for graduation who earned a grade point average of 3.900

Presidential Medallion

The presidential medallion consists of a large silver Carroll University seal that is highlighted in gray enamel. Directly above the seal is a silver leaf banner bearing the name of the current president. Further up the chain, each side is flanked by two small, silver Carroll College seals, also highlighted in gray enamel. The chain culminates in two silver Presbyterian crosses on each side. The connecting links are made up of individual silver curved banners engraved with the names of Carroll's preceding 14 presidents and their dates of leadership.

Mace Bearer

Formal academic processions include a mace bearer, whose metal mace is the symbol of the university's authority. During medieval times, the function of this person was to defend the president of the university. As a result, custom dictates that the mace bearer always be in sight of the president. During the Commencement ceremony, the mace is placed on a rack in full view of the audience and easily accessible to the mace bearer. This indicates that the university faculty is present to conduct formal and legal business. Carroll's mace was designed by Marceil Pultorak, Professor Emeritus of Art, and features a set of medallions displaying the official seal and motto of the institution. The mace was first used during Baccalaureate and Commencement ceremonies in 1987.

Academic Procession

In addition to the mace bearer, the academic procession includes members of the board of trustees, faculty and administration of Carroll University, graduates and honored guests. The tradition of the bagpipe band comes from the Scottish Presbyterian Church. At the beginning of their first year, new students are escorted into the university's Opening Convocation by a single bagpiper. Today, we honor our graduates by piping them into and out of the ceremony with a full complement of bagpipers.

Official Presbyterian Cross

On June 8, 1985, the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church (USA) voted unanimously to adopt the symbol found on the back of this program as the official seal of our denomination. This symbol can also be seen on Shattuck Music Center.

We are invited to see in it whatever we see, but among the artist's ideas are a fish and a dove, a cross, triangle, a chalice and flames. The half-circle suggests the circle of the Celtic Cross, a symbol long associated with Presbyterian history. The flames remind us of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. One can also see a pulpit with the contours of an open book, emphasizing the importance our Reformed tradition has placed on the role of scripture in our faith and lives. The flames are designed so that, with the center of the cross as one point, and the bottom of the design as a side, we can see a triangle, reaffirming our Trinitarian faith.

Some people also see in the design the suggestion of a person. Perhaps it is Jesus... perhaps it is you.

International Flags

As part of this weekend's celebration, Carroll University is proud to fly the flags representing the country of origin of each of the graduating international students. These flags can be found on the flag plaza near East Avenue, below the flags of the United States of America, State of Wisconsin and Carroll University.

China—Red field with a large yellow star and four smaller stars in its upper hoist corner

France—Three equal vertical bands of blue (hoist side), white and red

Japan—White field bearing a crimson-red circle at its center

Mongolia—Vertical triband with a red stripe at each side and a blue stripe in the middle, with the Mongolian Soyombo symbol centering on the hoist-side stripe

Peru—Three equal, vertical bands of red (hoist side), white, and red with the coat of arms centered in the white band; the coat of arms features a shield bearing a vicuna, cinchona tree (the source of quinine), and a yellow cornucopia spilling out gold coins, all framed by a green wreath

Class Flag

The Class Flag for each graduating class is flown during the final week of classes and throughout Commencement Weekend to celebrate and honor the graduating class as they are welcomed into the Alumni community.
