## PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Carroll University's Master of Arts in Teaching (MAT) is a 36-credit program completed in four semesters, beginning in the Fall of 2026 and ending within 16-months after the following Fall semester. By preparing teachers who are licensed in both general education and special education, this Teacher Training project addresses critical teacher shortage areas facing Wisconsin, including Elementary/Middle Education, Special Education, Mathematics and Science. Partner school districts include the School District of Waukesha, Greenfield School District, Wauwatosa School District and the West Allis-West Milwaukee School District.

## LIMITED GRANT FUNDS AVAILABLE

Students enrolled in the MAT Program who meet the eligibility requirements can receive the following grant funds:

- 50% of the cost of tuition for the 36-credit program (\$9,180 for Fall 2026-Fall 2027)
- \$400 to be applied to the cost of textbooks
- \$2,100 stipend to be paid during the student teaching semester (Fall 2027) if candidates are not employed as a teacher on a license with stipulations
- \$250 at the end of their program to be applied to the cost of applying for two licenses through WI-DPI

## ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

*Candidates must agree to complete their three field experiences and student teaching in a school that meets the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction (WDPI) guidelines for serving low-income and/or urban areas. Contact us for a complete list of eligible schools.*
